

BYLAW NO.5/2013


A BYLAW OF THE RESORT VILLAGE OF TOBIN LAKE IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN KNOWN AS THE ZONING BYLAW

The Council of the Resort Village of Tobin Lake, in the province of Saskatchewan, in open meeting, enacts as follows:

1. Under the authority of *The Planning and Development Act, 2007*, the Mayor and Council of the Resort Village of Tobin Lake, in the Province of Saskatchewan, adopt the "Zoning Bylaw" of the Resort Village of Tobin Lake.
2. The Zoning Bylaw is to regulate development and to control the use of land in the Resort Village of Tobin Lake.
3. The intent of this Bylaw is to provide for the amenity of the area and for the health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Village:
 - a. To minimize land use conflicts;
 - b. To establish minimum standards to maintain the amenity of the Village;
 - c. To ensure development is consistent with the physical limitations of the land;
 - d. To restrict development that places undue demand on the Village's infrastructure.
4. Development shall hereafter be permitted within the limits of the Resort Village of Tobin Lake only when in conformity with the provisions of this Bylaw.
5. Bylaw No. 4/93 is hereby repealed.
6. This Bylaw shall come into force on the date of final approval by the Minister.
